The Director of Public Affairs & Ally Engagement is responsible for overseeing LCADV's training and technical assistance for various allied professionals, maintaining and expanding collaborative relationships within various fields, managing the agency's communications, and assisting in public policy efforts.

This position reports to the LCADV Executive Director.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Manage and implement LCADV's ally engagement program, including development and implementation of statewide trainings and expansion of supportive membership program

Provide ongoing technical assistance to criminal justice, healthcare, housing, and education system representatives

Manage LCADV's communications, including media relationships, newsletters, and social media presence

Assist with public policy efforts as they pertain to engaging allies in ending domestic violence

Supervision of ally engagement team members

Provide in person and web-based training to allies and the public

Represent LCADV on various boards and task forces, as needed

Implement additional projects of service to member programs and allies, as needed

Completion of programmatic and grant reports, as required

Understanding of the role of state domestic violence coalitions and domestic violence programs in the intervention and prevention of domestic violence.

Clear understanding of domestic violence dynamics and promising practices in criminal justice response

Bachelors' degree and 3 years' experience in domestic violence or related field, or a minimum of 7 years' experience in the field.

Effective public speaking and training development skills.

Ability to effectively supervise staff members and to work cooperatively as part of a team.

Ability to maintain confidentiality in all matters.

Ability to function effectively in stressful and/or crisis situations.

Commitment to work hours as needed to complete assigned responsibilities.

Demonstrated ability to manage time, evaluate progress, and to adjust tasks/activities to complete work within established time frames.

Ability to work independently with self-discipline and self-motivation.

Ability to work with people of diverse backgrounds.
